Stukeley's Annual Parish Meeting was held on Monday 11th May 2026 at 19:00pm at Great Stukeley Village Hall.

Present – Cllr T Pinner (Chairman), Emily Pacey (Clerk), DCllr L Ascroft, DCllr A Blackwell and 4 members of the public who are prepared to take office.

To receive and approve apologies for absence.

DCllr T Sanderson sent his apologies.

The Chairman congratulated Ann Blackwell, Tom Sanderson and Louise Ascroft on their election as District Councillors for the Stukeley Ward.

To approve the APM of Electors minutes held on 12th May 2025.

It was agreed to approve the annual parish meeting of electors minutes held on the 12th May 2025.

Chairman's Report 2025-2026.

Chairman's Report – Stukeley Parish Council 2025–2026

I am pleased to present this report outlining the work and achievements of Stukeley Parish Council during the 2025–2026 year. It has been a productive and forward-looking year, with significant improvements delivered across all areas of the parish. The Parish Council installed two additional defibrillators within the villages, increasing access to lifesaving equipment and strengthening community resilience.

Our Local Highways Improvement (LHI) bid for 2025–2026 was successful, securing funding for small-scale safety measures at the Church Way / Ermine Street junction. This project will help improve visibility and reduce risk at a key point in the village.

We continued to keep the villages looking clean, tidy, and well maintained, working closely with our grass-cutting contractor, Beam, to ensure high standards throughout the year and our maintenance contractor T&S Gardening.

Additional dog waste bins were installed to support responsible dog ownership and maintain a pleasant environment for all residents.

The Council supported both village halls through the installation of solar panels at Great Stukeley Village Hall and Little Stukeley Village Hall, helping reduce running costs and improve sustainability.

We approved significant grant funding for the extension and upgrade of Little Stukeley Village Hall, enabling the Committee to continue improving this important community asset.

A grant was also awarded to the Beacon Centre to support the refurbishment of their toilets, ensuring the facility remains accessible and fit for purpose.

The car park at Great Stukeley Village Hall was resurfaced, improving safety and accessibility for hall users.

The Parish Council installed two new bus shelters within the village, providing improved comfort and protection for residents using public transport.

The Council has remained fully aligned with its approved budget throughout the year.

Importantly, we have not increased the precept for 2026–2027, reflecting careful financial management and a commitment to minimising the burden on residents. Our next major project for the coming year is the refurbishment of the play area at Great Stukeley, ensuring it remains safe, modern, and enjoyable for local families. I would like to extend my sincere thanks to all Parish Councillors for their dedication, hard work, and support throughout the year. Their commitment to the community continues to drive the progress and improvements we are able to deliver. I would like to give thanks to the Clerk for her continued hard work in ensuring the Council remains fully compliant with its financial regulations and Standing Orders. Her diligence, organisation and attention to detail were recognised as key to keeping the Council running smoothly and effectively.

Questions to the County and District Councillors (if present).

Following the elections held on Thursday 7th May, Tom Sanderson, Ann Blackwell and Louise Ascroft were elected as District Councillors for the Stukeleys Ward. Cllr A Blackwell advised that Full Council meetings will now resume, having been paused during the election period. The first Full Council meeting is scheduled for Thursday 21st May 2026.

Election of Chairman and Chairmans Declaration of Acceptance of Office.

Cllr T Close proposed Cllr T Pinner to stand for Chairman for Stukeley PC, Cllr P Pearce seconded and all Councillors were in favour. Cllr T Pinner accepted and thanked members accordingly and has signed his declaration of acceptance of office.

Members Declaration of Office.

Cllr SJ Gaule, Cllr P Pearce, Cllr P Tuck and Cllr G Evans signed their declaration of acceptance of office.

Election of Vice Chairman and Vice Chairmans Declaration of Acceptance of Office.

Cllr SJ Gaule proposed Cllr T Close to stand for Vice Chairman for Stukeley PC, Cllr P Tuck seconded and all Councillors were in favour. Cllr T Close accepted and thanked members accordingly and has signed his declaration of acceptance of office.

Update from Urban and Civic.

Cllr. Close reported that the NHS works for the new surgery above the Co-op are scheduled to commence. The steels for the new shop units outside the Co-op are scheduled to be installed by the end of the month. The development of the Secondary School is also progressing well.

To receive and approve the minutes of the meeting held on the 13th April 2026.

It was agreed to approve the minutes of the previous full Council meeting held on the 13th April

Cllr P Tuck proposed, Cllr P Pearce seconded and all were in favour.

Planning / Tree Works Applications Update.

26/00427/REM - Alconbury Weald Ermine Street Little Stukeley - Reserved Matters application for the matters of access, appearance, landscaping, layout and scale for residential development of 310 dwellings and associated infrastructure pursuant to outline planning permission 19/01341/OUT.

Stukeley Parish Council have no comment on this application.

26/00692/FUL - 85 Ermine Street Little Stukeley Huntingdon - Erection of a self-build bungalow including formation of a new vehicular access.

Stukeley Parish Council objects to this planning application. The Council supports the comments made in the Highways report and emphasises that adequate parking and turning space must be provided for both the proposed dwelling and the existing host property. In addition, the Parish Council considers the proposed vehicular access arrangements to be unsafe. Two separate single accesses should be provided. The current proposal, which relies on an access positioned on the corner, presents a significant safety concern due to restricted visibility and the complexity of vehicle movements at that point.

20/00847/OUT - Land Northwest of Ermine Business Park Ermine Street Great Stukeley - Outline planning application for the phased development of up to 648 dwellings with associated public open space, services and other ancillary infrastructure with all matters reserved except for the means of access.

Stukeley Parish Council has no objection to this application. However, the Parish Council notes that, once this development is constructed, there will be insufficient land remaining to accommodate the required A141 realignment and associated safety barrier.

26/00732/S73 - Land Southwest of 10 Green End Great Stukeley - Variation of condition 2 (approved plans) of 22/00810/FUL (Proposed 2no. Detached Dwellings with attached Carports and Site access)

Stukeley Parish Council objects to this planning application, as the proposed development lies outside the designated settlement boundary set out in the Stukeleys Neighbourhood Plan.

26/00708/PIP - Land Southwest Of 10 Green End Great Stukeley - Permission in Principle for erection of 1 dwelling.

Play Areas risk Assessment – nothing to report.

Defibrillators – nothing to report.

Street Lighting – nothing to report.

Parish Magazine – nothing to report.

Allotments – It was noted that the water pump at the allotments has broken and cannot be repaired. It was agreed to purchase a replacement pump at a cost of £225.00. Cllr G Evans proposed, Cllr T Close seconded, and all were in favour.

Cllr P Pearce suggested holding a 'Best Allotment' competition in August. This will be added to the June agenda for consideration and approval. It was also agreed to email those allotment tenants who have not been maintaining their plots and whose allotments have become overgrown. Tenants will be advised that, if the required maintenance is not carried out, the eviction process will begin.

Trees & Footpaths Maintenance – Cllr T Close reported that several trees along Ermine Street appear to be dead. He will email the Clerk with the locations so that the matter can be raised with Cambridgeshire County Council and Huntingdon District Council.

Great Stukeley Pocket Park Update.

Update on the installation of the new play area

The Clerk reported that Whiting's have accepted the Council's proposal that the final total of their quotation, including the muck-away element, must not exceed a 10% increase on the original quoted amount. A start date for the play area installation is still awaited from Whiting's. The Clerk advised that Mark from BCA is continuing to chase this.

Update on the tree survey from Whiting's Landscape

Cllr T Pinner reported that Whiting's met with Cllr T Close on the 24th April to carry out the tree survey at Great Stukeley Playing Field. He advised that Whiting's have now

replaced the small bushes that had died and will also be replacing the 14 failed trees. In addition, several trees require pruning, which Whiting's have agreed to undertake.

Update from Cllr P Pearce from the DMC Meeting held on the 23rd April 2026.

Cllr P Pearce updated Councillors on the Newlands Logistics Park Development Management Committee meeting held on 23rd April 2026 at HDC. He reported that the outline application was approved by a narrow margin of 6 votes to 5, with 2 abstentions.

Cllr Pearce advised that he objected to the application, raising concerns regarding traffic impacts on Views Common Road, clarification issues within the Highways report, and the conflict with the Stukeleys Neighbourhood Plan. He also highlighted recent traffic surveys showing that Brampton Hut and the A1 are already operating at capacity, as well as concerns about flooding, noting that although the attenuation ponds have been increased in size, there has been no reduction in the proposed building heights.

He further reported that the Residents' Association had raised significant concerns about traffic, but Highways maintained the view that the network could accommodate the additional vehicle movements.

North Huntingdon Cumulative Impacts Group Update.

Cllr T Close advised that the next meeting of the North Huntingdon Cumulative Impacts Group will take place on 20th May. He confirmed that he will attend and will provide an update at the June Parish Council meeting.

To renew Stukeley Parish Council's insurance from 1st June 2026 – 31st May 2027.

It was agreed that Stukeley Parish Council will renew its insurance policy with Hiscox for the period 1st June 2026 to 31st May 2027 at a cost of £1,691.16. The policy provides comprehensive protection for all Parish Council assets, includes all-risks cover, incorporates data-protection-related risks, and maintains public liability insurance as part of the Council's core risk-management arrangements.

Correspondence and Communications.

The Huntingdon to Alconbury Weald Active Travel Shared-Use Facility has now completed the procurement stage through the Eastern Highways Framework. Henderson and Taylor have been selected as the preferred contractor. Contract finalisation is currently underway, with construction scheduled to begin in the final week of May.

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Alconbury Weald update

From master developer, Urban&Civic

The Summer edition of Make/News – our community magazine - will be coming out this month, bringing you the latest updates on the development, schools, homes, travel and community life.

The first phase of the development is now well advanced, with more than 1,300 homes delivered so far, alongside 1.5 million sq ft of business space at the Enterprise Campus. Facilities and amenities continue to grow too, including the recent opening of Swynford Coffee. Work is also underway on the next elements of the neighbourhood, including a new health centre above the Co-op, additional shops at The Glade, the secondary school and the final section of Garland Park

Progress is continuing across the next phases of Alconbury Weald. Infrastructure works are underway in the northern part of Phase 2 to support new homes, with Barratt Homes submitting plans for a mix of one-bedroom apartments and maisonettes, alongside two, three and four-bedroom homes to create a balanced and inclusive neighbourhood with a wide range of housing options.

Phase 3 is also moving forward, with planning consent recently granted for the first homes. Infrastructure work has started for the future Runway Park and proposals for the new Sports Hub are being finalised.

Meanwhile the framework for Phase 4 is progressing following feedback from residents and local communities earlier this year. The development framework and design codes will help shape future housing parcels, green spaces and infrastructure, ensuring a cohesive and high-quality neighbourhood as Alconbury Weald continues to grow.

Make/News will also provide the latest news from Prestley Wood Academy, Ermine Street Church Academy and Jemima House Day Nursery, an introduction to Alconbury Weald Community Association's new committee, information on the regular clubs, groups and classes and details of the forthcoming community events.

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One Leisure Huntingdon expansion plans

HDC have announced plans to expand One Leisure Huntingdon, including a new 8-lane pool, an expanded gym, and a new larger soft play area - helping to fix the shortage of swimming and other facilities in Huntingdonshire, where there's not enough even for our current population.

The project has approval from the planning team and financial approval will be considered in early 2026, Construction would be set to begin later in 2026, with the expansion planned to open in 2028, helping current and new residents access good quality leisure facilities.

HDC keeps car park prices frozen for 4 years

Huntingdonshire District Council has kept car park prices frozen for the fourth year in a row, following a decision made in December. This means that the current administration has prevented any increase in parking costs for their entire term, keeping costs low for residents and supporting the local economy.

We are always working to keep the council running efficiently, meaning more money can stay in residents' pockets like this.

Under-25s Tiger Bus Pass saved

Following lobbying of the combined authority Mayor of Cambs, the Tiger Pass which lets under-25s travel on buses for £1 has been protected until April 2027. Local Councillors were a key part of the campaign to save the pass.

We know how much of a lifeline the Tiger Pass is for young residents so pleased to have played a role in achieving this.
